Industrial visits:

In order to have an exposure to industry every department organise field visits and industrial visits to enhance the learning experience, to have a hands-on experience and to have a wider industrial knowledge exposure.

Some of the visits include -

- visit to Dairy Delight Ice Cream factory and Regal Bag factory Bengaluru, the visit enriched the students' knowledge about the manufacturing process in the industry
- Staff and final year students visited the Police Commissioner Office and interacted with DCP K Ramarajan. He spoke about precautions and prevention against cybercrimes. Budding Journalists had practical exposure to Command center activities such as Social Media Wing, GPS & Media Monitoring and control room for different operations related to various crimes. Inspector Anand, PSI Tippu Sultan Naikwadi and ASI Pavithra gave practical insight to helpline 112 and Save-the-Soul Suraksha App. Mr. Jagadish briefed about CAD Dashboard monitor and tracking of Hoysala Vehicle. Cyber Cell Cops gave PPT Presentation on Cybercrime.
- Industrial tour to Coimbatore and Ooty, and visited Sri Naren Textiles in Coimbatore and Doddabetta Tea & Chocolate Factory in Ooty.
- The Department organized a one-day Industrial visit for to Regal Bag Factory and Dairy Delight, KR Puram, Bangalore.
- As part of the practical requirement of the final year degree program, the students were taken on an industrial visit to Mysore where they visited two industries. The first one being Sula Wines, Channapatna The next company that we visited was the Mysuru Milk Union Limited (MYMUL).
- The Botany, Biotechnology and the Eco Club members visited the Lalbagh Flower Show organised by the Lalbagh Botanical Garden on account of celebrating the 75th year of India's Independence- Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.
- Academy of Pastry and Culinary Arts to observe and study the process of baking.
- Indian Institute of Pasty and Culinary Art a unit of IIHM 16th July 2022 and 23rd July 2022 –
- Industrial visit to Kaiga Nuclear Power Plant in Karwar, Karnataka. It has four units with pressurized heavy water reactors of 220Mw gross. The main idea of the

Industrial visit was to show the students how the various proceedings happening in Kaiga generating station (KGS) and opportunities it provides for students to get into internships and job opportunities for B.Sc. The students had good time to explore and learn the working model of power station.

• Local exhibition at DGQA- Directory General of Quality Assurance, Bangalore organized by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Defense. The students could explore equipment's and model of radars and engine's, which is used in Indian army, they gained lots of knowledge from this informative and it was fun learn exhibition.

VACCINATION DRIVE:

COVID-19 TEST DRIVE

In December 2021, The college in association with the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP)organized an RT-PCR TEST for all the second and third-year students on the 16th and the 17th of December. A random selection from each class was made. The students were sent class-wise to the seminar hall for the test. Around 250 students benefitted from this drive. All COVID-19 protocols were followed on both days. The student council along with the Student Welfare Committee helped maintain decorum and social distancing. The students received their test reports a few days later. The results were negative for all the 250 students who underwent the test.

• Elastic cut Campaign was conducted creating awareness to encourage the people around us to dispose of the used masks in a proper manner.

• Bridge English – The students used to visit YWCA NGO School to teach Basic English, grammar and communication skills. The students were provided with study material such as charts and worksheets. The students were also taught about the significance of the tricolour in the national flag and the nation India.

• Sports Day Celebration- The students also helped the school authorities to conduct Annual Sports Day in the school premises.

• Gratitude Drive – Students recognised the security men of the college for their hard work and their tireless efforts to safeguard the college and the students.
